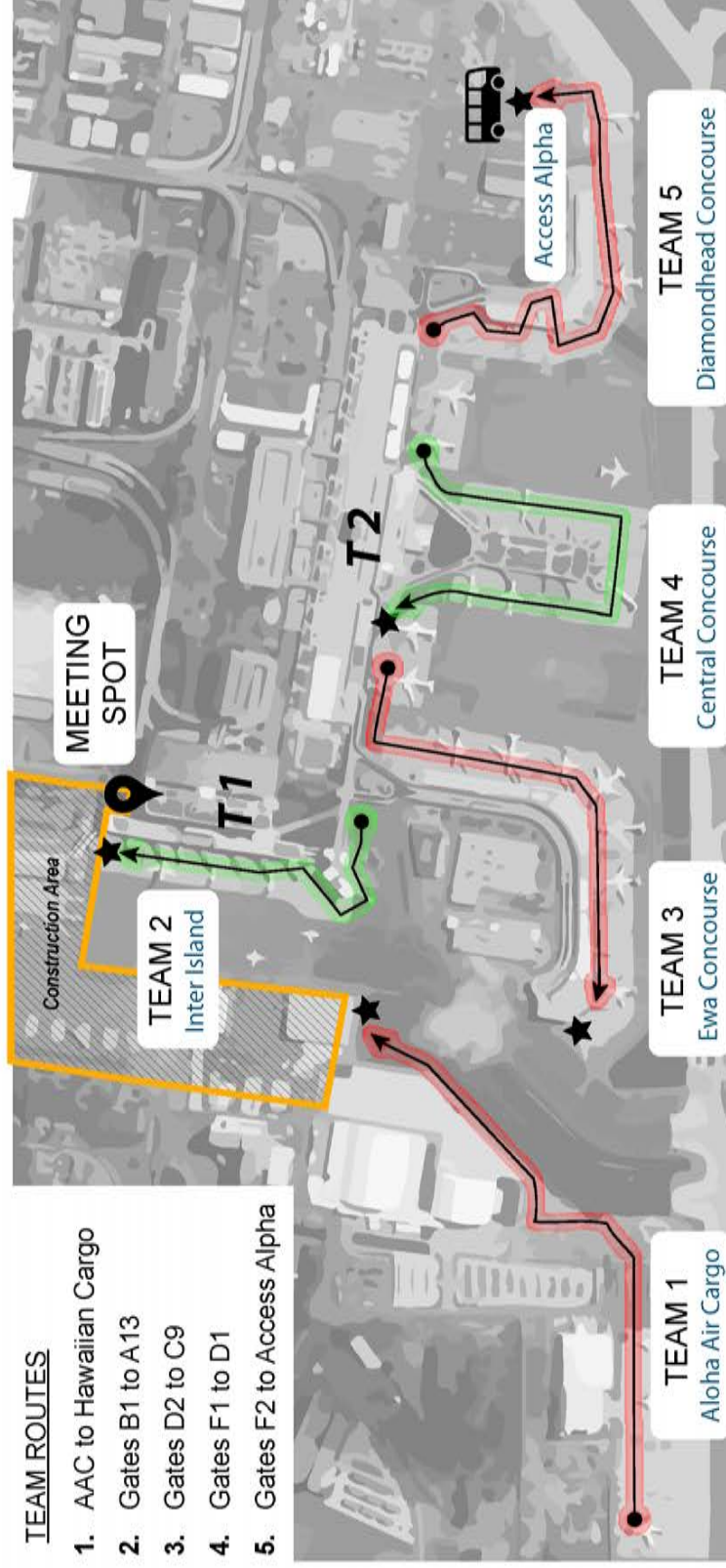
FOD WALK ROUTE MAP - SPRING 2019

NORTH RAMP

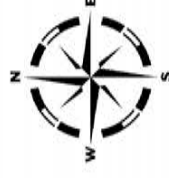

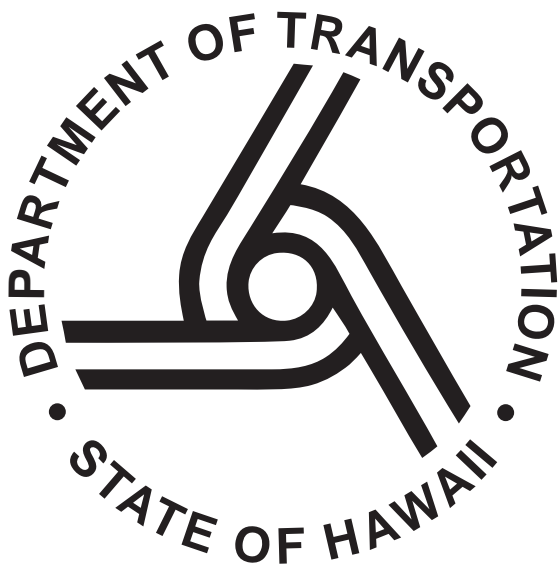
